Form

can + the base form of verbs <Example> I can speak English.

Meaning

Ability: I can skate. / Permission: You can use my ruler.

Negative sentences with the verb "can" → cannot (can't)

Affirmative Sentences

- · You can jump high.
- · She can swim.
- · He can run fast.
- · They can read the road sign.

Negative Sentences

- · You cannot jump high.
- · She cannot swim.
- · He cannot run fast.
- · They cannot read the road sign.
